Gong Yan has served as the director of Power Station of Art (PSA) since 2013. Prior to her role at PSA, Gong Yan was Chief-Editor of Art World magazine, having graduated from Ecole Nationale Superieur des Beaux-Art, Paris, and becoming professor at Shanghai Institute of Visual Art. In 2019, she received the Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres from the French Minister of Culture.

Gong Yan's curated exhibitions include Ordinary Architecture (the Chinese Pavilion in the 11th International Architecture Venice Biennale), Shinohara Kazuo, Mobile Architecture: Yona Friedman, Snacks, Yu Youhan (PSA Collection Series), Li Shan (PSA Collection Series), Body Media, HON: Niki de Saint Phalle & Shen Yuan, Hussein Chalayan: Archipelago, and Impermanence — 40 Years of Estúdio Campana.

Beatrice Galilee is a New York-based curator, writer and cultural advisor, internationally recognized for her expertise in global contemporary architecture and design. She is Founder and Executive Director of global design platform The World Around. From 2014–2019, she served as the first curator of contemporary architecture and design at New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art. Galilee is a visiting professor at Pratt Institute, where she lectures on curating. She is the author of Radical Architecture of the Future (Phaidon, 2021).

Béatrice Grenier is a Paris-based curator and writer, and the current Director of Strategic Projects at Fondation Cartier pour l'art contemporain. As the Paris desk editor of ArtAsiaPacific, Grenier writes on natural and urban landscapes and their relationship to contemporary visual culture. She is the co-author of Tashkent: A Modernist Capital (Rizzoli International, 2024) and The Architecture of Art (Rizzoli), set to be published in 2025. Prior to her current role at Fondation Cartier, Grenier served as Content Strategy Consultant at Google Arts and Culture in China.

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KUNLÉ ADEYEMI



Kunlé Adeyemi is a Nigerian architect, professor, and development strategist. In 2010, he founded NLÉ, an Amsterdam-based architecture, design, and urbanism practice. Meaning "at home" in Yoruba, NLÉ's research focuses on the rapid growth of cities in developing countries, observing the

world's most energetic urban centers to question existing conventions in urban development and offer innovative, sustainable design responses. Adeyemi's Makoko Floating School in Lagos gained international attention and received numerous awards, including the Silver Lion at the 15th Venice Architecture Biennale in 2016. From a prototype located in Lagos Lagoon, Nigeria, the project evolved into the Makoko Floating System, a prefabricated building solution for developments on water that has so far been deployed in five countries across three continents, forming part of NLÉ's broader research project, African Water Cities. Adeyemi is one of UNDP's African Influencers for Development Supergroup.

PETRA BLAISSE INSIDE OUTSIDE



Since founding her acclaimed studio Inside Outside in 1991, Dutch designer Petra Blaisse has worked on international projects of increasing technical ambition and scale

alongside partners Jana Crepon, landscape architect (left), and Aura Luz Melis, project architect (right). Aspiring for their projects to engage in continual dialogue with their contexts, the multidisciplinary studio's spaces are designed to stimulate and adapt, each a product of deep research. Sound and light, climate and the effects of time are the team's tools. Inside Outside's renowned landscape projects include the Shenzhen Stock Exchange Gardens, the Biblioteca degli Alberi in Milan, and the Qatar Foundation Headquarters and National Library public gardens in Doha. Their ongoing work spans from the regeneration of an urban park in Paris for Demi Lune, La Defense, to an ecological strategy for the Vallée de L'Oued Issy in Morocco.

CHO MINSUK MASS STUDIES



Cho Minsuk is a Korean architect and the founder of Seoul-based studio Mass Studies. Following his time at such renowned firms as OMA Rotterdam, Cho established Mass Studies in 2003 as a critical investigation of architecture in the 21st Century, committed to contributing to a broader architectural

discourse through socio-cultural and urban research. Cho has received numerous international awards including the Golden Lion for his commission and co-curation of the Korean Pavilion at the 14th Venice Architecture Biennale in 2014. Earlier this year, he unveiled his design for the prestigious Serpentine Pavilion in London's Kensington Gardens. Across three of Cho's most recent projects in South Korea—the Osulloc Tea Factory and Museum buildings on Jeju Island, and the Choru visitor centre, which lies low among the Obongsan Mountains to the north—the Mass Studies has been initiating dialogues between contemporary architecture and the country's foodscapes, speaking to a wider question of how what we build relates to the landscapes responsible for supporting life on Earth.

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ANDRA MATIN ANDRA MATIN STUDIO



Andra Matin—the founding principal of Jakarta-based andramatin studio—is one of Indonesia's most venerated architects. Over more than a hundred projects completed across the Indonesian archipelago, the studio has aimed to stimulate a dialogue between the global and the local,

utilizing modernization to enable tradition to adapt and sustain local material cultures. Through his approach, the ambitions of Tropical Modernism are brought into contact with the broad range of building practices seen across the country, responding sensitively to local ecosystems and cultural practices. His latest installation, "Elevation," which presented research on the divergent architectural vernaculars that developed from Indonesia's tropical climate, received one of two Special Mentions while in exhibition at the 16th Venice Biennale in 2018. Matin's renowned design of the Banyuwangi Airport terminal received the 2022 Aga Khan Award for Architecture, epitomising the architect's inclination to bring the local landscape in through his buildings' doors.

ANI SAFARYAN



Ani Safaryan is an architect and urbanist at DnA_Design and Architecture, based in Beijing. Founded by Xu Tiantian, DnA has continually engaged in the social and economic revitalization of rural China through its "architectural acupuncture," wherein small, targeted interventions create meaningful change

within local communities. The studio engages in projects of varied scales, beginning with contextual research to design spaces that respond to both functional and social needs. Led by Xu's philosophy, the practice aspires toward an architecture that adapts, engages, and contributes to the complexity of contemporary life, inspiring new possibilities for its users and surrounding communities. In recent years, DnA has applied their approach to the pressure points of sites across China, from the post-industrial landscapes of abandoned stone quarries in Jinyun County; to Meizhou Island, off the coast of Putian, where spiritual pilgrimage and mass tourism, traditional farming practices and strict conservation policies co-exist in fragile balance.

LIU JIAKUN JIAKUN ARCHITECTS



Liu Jiakun is the founding principal of Jiakun Architects and one of China's most renowned contemporary architects. Based in Liu's hometown, Chengdu, the firm's portfolio spans large-scale masterplanning, urban design, landscape architecture, interior design, product design, and

art installations. Through deep attention to social realities, local context, and vernacular craftsmanship, Liu uses contemporary design to interpret traditional Chinese aesthetics and folk wisdom, bringing into focus the fine, interwoven texture of personal and collective memories. Liu's designs are led by a deep commitment to serving people in need, many casting light on the reciprocal relationship between Chinese people's public life and urban cultural space. Anticipating completion in 2027, the firm's landscape design for the Hangzhou Steelworks Park is transforming the disused industrial site into a cultural landmark, aiming to return the Zhejiang Province's first steel plant to a source of regional pride.

GROUNDWORK: INTO THE ISLAND



In the summer of 2022, DnA was invited to design a potential museum building on Meizhou Island, located off the coast of principal architect Xu Tiantian's hometown of Putian. Famous as the site which gave birth to the cult of the sea goddess Mazu, the island is an environment where religious pilgrimages and mass tourism, traditional farming techniques, and strict conservation policies co-exist in a fragile balance.

Regulated by the timing of the tides and the rituals of sea cultivations, Meizhou Island is the set where ideas for a diffused life museum and a series of precise interventions were conceived in dialogue with and in service to villagers, fisherfolks, and experts in marine biology. Into the Island is a snapshot of a fluid design process, a story of encounters, a narrative composed through the fragments of an evolving culture and fluctuating landscape.

Into the Island is the first chapter of Groundwork, a three-part film and exhibition series produced by the Canadian Centre for Architecture (CCA), exploring the conceptual development and field research of contemporary architects cultivating alternative modes of engagement.
